Who can get the KiJu Card?

Education and participation in social life are important for healthy development and the future opportunities of children and young people. The variety of offers available in Singen

including the areas of sports, music, culture, education and leisure should therefore be equally accessible to all Singen children and young people – regardless of family income.

That is why the association Kinderchancen e.V. and the City of Singen together created the KiJu Card for families on low incomes. The idea is that attractive discounts will enable more participation. And so that as many children and young people as possible can use the card, it is distributed with little bureaucracy at many different issuing sites.

The City of Singen reserved a specific budget for the KiJu Card and, in the first two years, received funding from the State of Baden-Württemberg from the programme "Active Child Poverty Prevention and Child Health Promotion". Many Singen associations, business people and institutions also cover part of the costs themselves.

All children and young people in Singen and its districts aged 0 to 17 years can apply for a KiJu Card if their parents receive

### Just a few steps to the KiJu Card

- 1. Simply fill out the application
- 2. Submit evidence of benefits
- 3. Submit child's ID card
- The KiJu Card is issued immediately free of charge in the name of the child.
